Mal de Débarquement Syndrome (MdDS) is a neurological condition¹ which is not well-known and often misdiagnosed. The disorder manifests primarily as a chronic sensation of motion, typically described as feeling "like I'm on a boat." Onset may be without a known trigger but most often includes a history of travel.

The primary symptoms of rocking, swaying and/or bobbing are often associated with cognitive impairment, visual motion intolerance, and a sense of unstable ground. Symptoms vary from mild to disabling. What is common among patients is the *persistence* of symptoms, lasting months to years. **Diagnostic criteria established by the Bárány Society and published in the Journal of Vestibular Research will aid you in diagnosing MdDS**.² The committee was chaired by Yoon-Hee Cha, MD, the leading expert on MdDS and our principal investigator.
